Business growth in downtown Ravenna is on the rise and we are actively working to bring in the amenities to support these businesses by creating more opportunities for retail and restaurant establishments. One of these opportunities is the former Oak Rubber building at 228 S. Sycamore St., which is being redeveloped into a mixed-use commercial space with apartments and space for seven restaurants or retail businesses with outdoor patio seating. As featured above, Heritage Ohio also is supporting Doug and Melissa Shelton's redevelopment of Riddle Block #9 with their first Save Ohio's Treasures grant. Additionally, street front space is currently available for commercial retailers to take advantage of downtown Ravenna's business growth. To aid in our efforts to bring better amenities and jobs to Ravenna, we have placed a moratorium on self-storage units from now until March of next year to allow us to assess zoning and explore other development plans for this land.
