



**Ravenna City Council
Regular Meeting Minutes
Monday, October 7, 2024, at 6:00 pm**

The Regular Council Meeting was held in person in Council Chambers.

The Regular Council Meeting was called to order at 6:00 P.M. October 7, 2024, by Council President, Rob Kairis

Delegations from the Public:

Ryan Saltsman addressed Council to express his concern at his home on Brittingham Dr. He explained that there was a terrible flood in August that flooded his backyard and ended just inches from his basement window. Mr. Saltsman said that his home did not flood but that he is trying to mitigate the problem so that there are no future issues. He stated that he spoke with some employees at the City about the issue and would like someone to come out to his property to review if another catch basin is needed.

Mr. Finney addressed issues with Mr. Saltsman and explained that his subdivision in Annevar Estates has grass swales that the HOA oversees that could help ease future flooding issues.

Ms. Micheal stated that the item is to donate the K-9 vehicle and that the City has donated to other communities before, including the Fire Department. She said that the Police Department felt it was a good thing to do.

Mr. Kairis agreed that it was a nice thing to pay it forward acknowledging that the City has received donations from other communities in the past.

Mr. Moskun said that the K-9 vehicle will be a huge asset to the Struthers Police Department. There being no further comments or questions.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-118 AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT AN APPLICATION TO THE OHIO PUBLIC WORKS COMMISSION FOR FUNDING FOR THE CENTRAL, FREEDOM, SPRUCE AND WALNUT STREET WATER AND SIDEWALKS IMPROVEMENTS, AND FURTHER AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR, IN THE EVENT THE APPLICATION IS APPROVED, TO EXECUTE THE NECESSARY CONTRACTS, AND TO PARTICIPATE IN FUNDING THE CITY’S LOCAL SHARE OF \$300,000.00 FOR THE SUBJECT PROJECT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Mr. Moskun stated that the item is to help fund water and sidewalk replacements, which include water service and valves replacements. He said a dollar amount has not yet been established.

It was noted that a small section of Freedom St. south of Perry Ave. would be improved.

Mr. Moskun stated that Cistone Excavating Services is a good local company that will be working on necessary storm improvements.

Mr. Harper noted that the City has been working on addressing storm water issues and that the process will take some time.

Mr. Moskun stated that the purchase of a new tractor and high-pressure nozzle are an asset to keeping storm and sanitary pipes clean and maintained. He explained that the high-pressure nozzle is needed for tough debris situations and that it will be a big asset for years to come.

ORDINANCE NO. 2024-122 AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 218 WEST MAIN STREET, RAVENNA, OHIO FROM NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Ms. Wood explained that the minipark next to Guido's is finished and Neighborhood Development Services (NDS) would like to transfer the property to the City of Ravenna.

Mr. Kairis stated that he would like the item to stay on first reading and that the property can transfer once the MOU and lease agreement are executed.

Mr. Soudil addressed his concerns that issues may arise in the future from potential drainage and construction issues.

Mayor Seman stated that the concerns have already been addressed.

Mr. Cimino stated that the property will be transferred as is, and then it is the City's responsibility to take care of the property thereafter. He stated that he spoke with Sam Cipriano who was concerned with the limitations of a 15-year lease, and said that the City will provide a lease that will continue with generational operations and if sold, the lease could continue to another restaurant operation.

Ms. West explained that the Parks and Recreation Department has appropriated ARPA funds to resurface the courts at City Park and would like to appropriate additional funds from the Park CI Fund to replace the fencing that is in disrepair.

Mr. Moskun asked if the item was an emergency.

Mr. Finney said yes, and that the funds needed to be in a contract for the project by the end of the year so that the federal government does not revoke the ARPA funds.

Mr. Moskun noted that semitrucks drive down Park Ave.

Mr. Calfee stated that it may be a good idea to ban parking on both sides of Park Ave. between Hillcrest and Beech streets, and if it is an issue Council can revisit the conversation.
